## **100 Street Corridor Construction Bulletin**

Beneath 100 Street, the 80-year-old water, sanitary, and storm sewer pipes need replacement. On the surface, the entire roadway and sidewalks will be reconstructed to reflect a high-quality urban design to match the vision created during the 100 Street Corridor Plan Design Charrette that took place in 2019.

OPEN

You will see features such as:

- Wider sidewalks to accommodate pedestrians and winter snow management
- Boulevard trees with an automated irrigation system
- New benches and furnishings
- Decorative lighting which improves visibility, but also helps create a safer street
- Left-hand turn lanes to make vehicle movements easier
- Dedicated space for roadway snow storage





#### Week of June 24, 2021 Update

Since the previous update on June 3, 2021, the following activities have occurred:

FORT ST. JOHN

- Completed storm sewer main installation up to 99 Avenue
- Completed sanitary sewer main installation up to 98a Avenue
- Installed services to properties and catch basins
- Completed water main tie-ins at 99 Avenue, 98a Ave, 97 Avenue (east portion) and 96 Avenue
- Continued Silva Cell installation for street trees, now complete up to 98a Avenue (east portion)

### Work planned for the reporting next period

- Installation of screw piles for traffic signals
- Continued installation of services and water main tie-ins at 98 Avenue and 97 Avenue (west portion)
- Begin Silva Cell installation between 96 and 97 avenue (west portion)
