

Beneath 100 Street, the 80-year-old water, sanitary, and storm sewer pipes need replacement. On the surface, the entire roadway and sidewalks will be reconstructed to reflect a high-quality urban design to match the vision created during the 100 Street Corridor Plan Design Charrette that took place in 2019.

You will see features such as:

- Wider sidewalks to accommodate pedestrians and winter snow management
- Boulevard trees with an automated irrigation system
- New benches and furnishings
- Decorative lighting which improves visibility, but also helps create a safer street
- Left-hand turn lanes to make vehicle movements easier
- Dedicated space for roadway snow storage





Week of July 4, 2022 Update

Since the previous update on June 20, 2022, the following activities have occurred:

- Silva-cell excavation and installation
- Electrical duct installation
- Sub-base and curbing installation prepration
- Sidewalk installation preparations
- Paved and reopened 99 Avenue intersection
- Irrigation installation activities

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Curbing along the west sidewalk from 99 Avenue to north of 100 Avenue
- Continued silva-cell excavation and installation
- Preparations and pouring of the centre concrete lane
- Underground utilities installation in the 101 Avenue intersection
- Sidewalk installation along the west portion of the project
