

# **Budget Highlights**

The City's budget ensures that our residents are provided with the services and capital assets they expect now and well into the future.

Below are some key highlights proposed in the Draft 2023 Budget:

- Non-tax revenues, such as user and rental fees, have nearly returned to pre-pandemic levels.
- Construction on the RCMP Detachment and 100 Street
  Revitalization continue. The road overlay program budget has
  been increased to be able to repair more roads. These capital
  projects are funded through the Peace River Agreement and
  are the result of extensive community engagement.
- In 2023, we will utilize a small portion of Peace River
  Agreement funds in the operating budget to recognize the
  operational effects of newly added capital investments.
- Thorough review identified several operational items that had previously been capitalized. For 2023, these will continue to be funded by the Peace River Agreement, but accounted for in the operational budget.
- Inflationary pressures have increased materials, goods and supplies.

### **Major Budget Factors**

The City of Fort St. John faces challenges due to changing responsibilities, additional expenses, and new or expanded service requirements. Below are a listing of major factors affecting the 2023 Operating Budget.





## **Operating Budget - Revenue sources**






