

Recreation Vaccine Card Plan

Community Services – October 31, 2021

By order of the Provincial and Regional Health Officers, proof of two-doses of COVID-19 vaccination is required to access some events, services, and businesses. All people accessing City facilities must follow the requirements outlined in the Provincial [Face Coverings and Gatherings and Events Orders](#), as well as the [Northern Health Gatherings and Events Order](#).

Masks are required for all patrons 5 years and older while in Recreation buildings.

Proof of Vaccination

- Proof of full vaccination is required for some programs and services beginning October 15, 2021
- People aged 18 years and older are required to produce one piece of photo identification with their Vaccine Card
- Patrons accessing City programs may give consent at the time of registration to note proof of vaccination on your ActiveNet account

Where Proof of Vaccine is Required:

- When attending adult or mixed-age (adult and child) programs and events
- Skating, and Northern Vac Track services
- When spectating programs, sporting events, and practices at all recreational facilities
- When entering concession seating areas in all buildings
- When volunteering, organizing, or coaching programs and events for children and youth

Where Proof of Vaccine is NOT Required:

- Organized sport and programs for children and youth
- Aquatic programs including swimming lessons and public swimming
- Before, during, and after school programs
- Educational activities when provided by a school or post-secondary institution
- Language and employment courses and training
- Government activities and services
- Flow through events with a safety plan and controls to prevent congregation

Spectators

- All spectators 12 years and older are required to show proof of vaccination in order to enter seating areas
- All adults are permitted to enter the building and assist a child in getting ready for their program

Programs & Bookings

- People 12 years and older registering in City programs are required to show proof of vaccination upon registration
- Users booking City facilities are responsible for verifying proof of vaccination for their participants

How do I get my BC Vaccine Card?

With your BC Services Card (identification), Personal Health Number, and the date of one of your vaccinations, you can:
