Accompanied by some of Northern B.C.'s finest musicians, she is a force to be reckoned with onstage and with her band brings a memorable and kinetically-charged performance to every venue they play. Her first full-length, full-band studio album, Psychic Knots (released September 2019), peaked at number 24 on Earshot's National Top 50 Radio, with follow up GOLD (released November 2021) charting in the Earshot National Top Ten, marking an exciting lead up to the release of their latest EP, IMMOLATION, released earlier this year.
