

Recreation Vaccine Card Plan

Community Services – September 11, 2021

By order of the BC Provincial Health Officer, proof of at least one COVID-19 vaccination is required to access some events, services, and businesses. Effective September 13, 2021, the City of Fort St John will require that proof of vaccination is verified for select programs and services as defined in this plan.

Proof of Vaccination

- Proof of one vaccination is required for some programs and services beginning September 13, 2021
- Proof of two vaccinations is required for some programs and services beginning October 24, 2021
- People aged 18 years and older are required to produce one piece of photo identification
- For ease, patrons may give consent at the time of registration to note proof of vaccination on your ActiveNet account

Where Proof of Vaccine is Required:

- Adult fitness, sport, or dance activities for those aged 22 years and older
- Events, bookings, and gatherings of more than 50 participants

Where Proof of Vaccine is NOT Required:

- Recreation and sport activities for those aged 21 years and under
- Public swimming, skating, and Northern Vac Track services, when not associated with an event
- Workers at the workplace, including coaches and volunteers who are required to run the program or service
- Before and after school programs
- Teachers and instructors providing education activities
- Language and employment courses and training
- Government activities and services

Spectators for Child and Youth Sport

- Spectators do not need to provide proof of vaccination, unless associated with an event
- Spectators for child and youth sport will be limited to no more than 25 people per set of bleachers at the Pomeroy Sport Centre
- Spectators for child and youth sport will be limited to no more than 50 people at the Kids Arena Field House
- Some seating may be closed in recreation buildings to manage gatherings

Programs & Bookings

- Adults registering in City-run fitness, sport, or dance activities are required to show proof of vaccination upon registration
- Organizers of adult sport and fitness activities will be responsible for verifying proof of vaccination of their participants
- Organizers of events with more than 50 persons will be responsible for verifying proof of vaccination of their participants
